It's the first new Federal Holiday since Martin Luther King Jr. Day was created in 1983. (Juneteenth was signed into law in 2021.)

Message from Pastor Nunes:

"What shall I return to the Lord for all his bounty to me?" (Psalm 116:12)

In *The Bounty*, his first book after winning the Nobel Prize in Literature, Derek Walcott offers a poetic way to say what's unsayable. How do we give thanks for that which comes from God? It's larger than life, encompassing all that we are and ever hope to be, packed with grace. Lava-like God's goodness and mercy overflows bloodred and hot—but not to harm, to heal and to forgive.

Walcott's verb of choice to describe this bounty of God is to shudder.

Shudder implies trembling with awe. It suggests an encounter with something that is larger than oneself. We shudder when we come face-to-face with the sacred. The kindness and generosity I have experienced at Pilgrim, in the words of the African American spiritual, "causes me to tremble, tremble, tremble." Because this love—all love worth living for or dying for—comes from the cross of Jesus Christ crucified.

In a time that was far too short, this was my experience with you. I shudder with thanksgiving at your commitment to worship the Holy Trinity, your drive to walk in the ways of the Spirit, your yearning to study God's Word, your hunger to eat and drink of Jesus' body and blood. I shudder the way you strive to love one another in Santa Monica and beyond.

Please continue to invite people to receive Jesus and to be baptized into his family of faith.

California Lutheran University Announces Leadership Transition

President Lori Varlotta to step down May 31; Dr. John Nunes to serve as interim president.

The California Lutheran University Board of Regents announced today that President Lori Varlotta will step down from her role effective May 31, 2024. Dr. John Nunes, most recently pastor at Pilgrim Lutheran Church in Santa Monica, Ca., and former president of Concordia College New York, will serve as interim president for a two-year term beginning on June 1, 2024. "On behalf of my Board of Regents colleagues, I extend sincere thanks to President Varlotta for her service, which leaves the university well positioned as we seek new leadership," said Board of Regents Chair Ann Boynton. "The future holds many challenges for higher education, and thanks to President Varlotta's work, Cal Lutheran is already moving to address several of them. During Rev. Dr. Nunes' tenure, we will continue to build on the university's strengths."

Varlotta was appointed president in September 2020 and successfully steered the university through the COVID-19 pandemic, leading efforts to bring Cal Lutheran students back to campus and to face-to-face learning ahead of many other California institutions. She made difficult but necessary changes to mitigate a potential financial crisis; implemented changes to align shared governance structures with university bylaws; and designed a Talent, Culture and Diversity division.

Nunes has served since 2020 on the Academic Leaders Task Force on Campus Free Expression at the Bipartisan Policy Center. The Task Force's recommendations about how to foster a campus culture of robust intellectual exchange during the current period of national polarization have been adopted by many universities, both public and private.



Nunes is a senior fellow at the Center for Religion, Culture and Democracy and was ordained as a Lutheran minister in 1991. He was also president and CEO of Lutheran World Relief and held an endowed professorship at Valparaiso University. He is the author of five books and numerous articles, and holds degrees from Concordia College, Ann Arbor (BA), Concordia Seminary in St. Catharines, Ontario (MDiv), and the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago (ThM and PhD). He and his wife, Monique, are the parents of six children and 13 grandchildren.

"God is up to great things at California Lutheran University," said Nunes. "In a world of digitized anonymity, Cal Lutheran represents a personalized community of learning on a beautiful campus where every person matters. I see this opportunity as vocationally aligned with my gifts and I am honored to serve Cal Lutheran by helping to galvanize a uniquely talented team of regents, faculty and staff in educating students for a global society."

"We look forward to welcoming Dr. Nunes and his family to the California Lutheran community," said Boynton. "His experience as a scholar, pastor, and leader makes him a natural choice for this interim role, and his embrace of the values that guide Cal Lutheran will serve him well as he works with the board to move the university forward over the next two years."

Dr. Nunes' appointment comes with the <u>support of the Region 1 bishops</u> and <u>Region 2 bishops</u> of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
