

Luther's Reformation Celebrates 507 Years!

On October 31st we will celebrate more than a "half a millennium" of Reformation freedom. On this day in 1517, Martin Luther posted the 95 Thesis on the Church door in Wittenberg, Germany and began the "Reformation of Christendom," calling God's people back to the Gospel, and away from man-made rules and pronouncements. Martin Luther was able to lead this Reform by the power of the Holy Spirit, speaking through the Words of Scripture. Romans 1:17. "In the Gospel a righteousness from God is revealed, a righteousness that is by Faith from first to last, just as it is written: The righteous will live by Faith." October 17th is "Earthquake Shake Out Day"

For years, we in California have observed the month of October as "Earthquake shake out day. We have "Earthquake Drills" in our offices and schools. The Red Cross and First Responders (Fire Departments and Police Departments) participate in these drills and TV News reporters film some of the drills. Check and update your earthquake supplies. Make sure your food and water is not outdated, make sure your First Aid Kit is up to date. If you are on prescription medication, make sure you can keep some of it in your emergency supplies. Perhaps your doctor can give you some prescription samples to store in your earthquake kits. Have a Bible in your kit! Have emergency radios and batteries, flashlights, clothing, work gloves, sun screen, shoes and hats ready. Have a pry bar and hammer ready in case you need to open a jammed door. It is a good idea to have three types of Earthquake Kits. The supplies you keep in the house, in a safe location, a "Grab and Go Bag" to take with you if you need to leave the house, and a small earthquake kit in your car. If you have pets, make sure you have food and water for them, and a carrying case if you need to evacuate. Keep a list of phone numbers of friends and relatives in your earthquake kit and have at least one out of state contact you can notify if you have telephone or cell phone working. Calling out of state will decrease the burden on our local phone service. Have a cell phone charger with you so when the service is back up, you can keep in contact with people. It is a good idea to have face masks in your eq kit to protect you from debris and smoke.

This year's International ShakeOut Day is October 17, when millions of people worldwide will participate in earthquake drills at work, school, or home! At 10:17 am (local time) on 10/17, you can join millions of people across California practicing <u>earthquake safety</u>. While we encourage you to participate with everyone, you can <u>register</u> your ShakeOut drill for any day of the year, and drill at a time of your choice. You can also include people in multiple locations through video conferencing.

WARNING CALIFORNIA From Pastor Ken Frese earthquake.ca.gov MyShake App

For those of you who know Pastor Frese, he does earthquake and emergency preparedness instructions. He has held conferences at Pilgrim and we like him very much.

Feeling a little "shook up" lately? Seismologists tell us that a series of little earth-quakes can be the prelude to the Big One we are expecting here in Southern California. During National Preparedness Month it's a good idea to prepare yourself and your loved ones for the catastrophic earth-quake predicted to come at any time. A useful resource is the official earthquake website for the State of California – **earthquake.ca.gov**.

This website provides accurate, up-to -date information on how to be prepared, as well as access to the free **MyShake App**. The MyShake App utilizes California's Earthquake Early Warning system to deliver warnings to people via cell phones before the strongest shaking arrives. Seconds to tens of seconds of alert can provide opportunity to take life-saving actions such as Drop, Cover, and Hold On and put devices into various forms of a safe mode. For the first time, you can receive warning of an earthquake before you feel shaking!





