

I recently heard a man go into a little bit of detail on his wish for a happy new year. My personal wish in 2025, he said is "for a big fat bank account and a nice slim body. I just hope these two wishes don't get mixed up like they did last year!" I hope he gets what he wishes for in 2025. I hope we all do, and all of us have a happy new year. But something tells me, before the New Year has even begun, that we're not all going to get what we wish for. We all want happiness but some of us may get some sadness in the New Year. We may very well run into some complicated situations, confront some sorrow, even deal with some suffering.

Our Savior knows all about that. Jesus made enemies, and he suffered rejection. Ultimately, he suffered crucifixion on a cross. To say it as directly as it should be said, God's plan was that his Son would go through hell so that we might go to heaven. 
