




But God doesn't call us to understand it- he call us to believe it. Think of the words of the Apostles' Creed or the Nicene Creed, which states, "I believe...in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only begotten Son of God, begotten of his Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God..." Do we understand them all? I know I don't. But do we believe those words capture the Biblical truths of who our God is and what He has done for us? So it is with the incarnation.

This Christmas season, let's savor the incomparable incarnation. We cannot repeat it. But we can and should stand in awe that the Word became flesh!
